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FAQs AND POLICIES FOR TICKETHOLDERS

Everyone must refrain from attending this screening if you are experiencing a fever, cough, shortness of breath, or any other symptoms associated with COVID-19, or if you have been diagnosed with COVID-19 or exposed to someone who has been diagnosed with COVID-19. All attendees are required to wear a mask fully covering their nose and mouth when outside of their vehicles or if they temporarily roll down a window during check in.

WHAT TIME CAN I ARRIVE?

Entrance for the screening will begin at **6:00 PM**. Vehicles will be placed on a first-come, first-served basis, one vehicle at a time, and in sections based on size of vehicle (i.e., SUVs/Trucks – will be placed on the sides and towards the back for ideal viewing for everyone).

HOW DO I REDEEM MY TICKET?

Upon your advance online purchase, the emailed purchase/donation confirmation will serve as your ticket. Tickets will not be purchasable on site and must be purchased in advance online. There is limited capacity, so we encourage early purchasing.

WHAT HAPPENS UPON ARRIVAL?

When you arrive at the event, please show the attendant emailed confirmation through your vehicle's rolled up window, either by holding up your printed version, or by displaying it on your phone or smart device. The attendant will then direct you. When entering the event, **please follow the guidance of our parking attendants**. They are working to maintain a social distance between cars and also placing taller vehicles/ SUVs' trucks to the sides and back areas. Your patience and cooperation are needed when parking.

DO I NEED FM RADIO IN MY VEHICLE?

YES! This is a "silent-style" Drive-In event, with no speakers. The film's soundtrack will be accessible exclusively through your vehicle's FM Radio, for maximum social-distance safety. We will provide you with the FM station upon arrival. **Please make sure your vehicle has an FM radio so you can hear the film — radio station apps will not work.**

WILL YOU HAVE FOOD FOR SALE?

Ticket purchase will include two small popcorns and two water bottles. Additional popcorn and water can be purchased from the same website as the event ticket. Additional food might be available for purchase in advance of the event – check back for more details. **Purchased food will be given to you upon entrance to the event.** You are also welcomed to bring your own snacks and soft drinks. Please help us keep the grounds tidy by disposing your trash in bins throughout the area.

WILL YOU HAVE RESTROOMS?

YES! Portable restrooms will be available. **As our approval of this event is based on our assurance of safety, we ask all attendees to properly wear protective masks (fully covering nose and mouth) when leaving your vehicles for any reason, including to use the restroom.** The restrooms will be kept sanitized throughout the evening. As such, there may be a wait — to ensure you don't miss any part of the show, please consider a pre-trip restroom stop before coming to the event.

CAN I SIT/STAND OUTSIDE OF MY VEHICLE?

Our approvals to host this event during these times is based on our strict assurance that require all guests to remain in their vehicles for the entire screening. As such, **we cannot allow attendees to sit, stand or congregate outside of their vehicles at any time. We are also not able to allow attendees to sit in their hatchbacks or the back of a pick-up truck.** We hope everyone understands and adheres to these policies for everyone's safety and enjoyment.

REMEMBER TO TURN YOUR ENGINE ON EVERY ONCE IN A WHILE...

As you will be running your battery non-stop in order to listen to the film on FM radio, you run the risk of killing your battery. We will be prepared with jumper cables for those who need them, but to eliminate the risk of your battery dying, remember to turn your vehicle on every once in a while.

...BUT MIND YOUR HEADLIGHTS!

Some vehicles have headlights that automatically turn on when the engine is turned over. There's generally a setting to eliminate that — please make an effort to switch that setting so your headlights don't come on when you power on your vehicle, as headlights wipe out the image on the screen. We will have cardboard and tablecloths on hand for vehicles that may need help with this — let an attendant know if you need materials to cover your headlights.

MIND YOUR DOME LIGHTS AND BRAKE PEDAL

We understand sometimes you have to flick on the dome light to look for something in your vehicle, but please don't have your dome light on for a stretched period of time — and certainly, not through the entire film. Any light proves very distracting to the audience around you. And lastly — we understand that it sometimes feels instinctual to do so, but please make an effort to keep your foot off your brake pedal. In a dark environment, brake lights provide quite the surprising glow.

WHAT HAPPENS AFTER THE MOVIE?

At the end of the film as the credits roll, attendees are encouraged to blink their lights to show appreciation. We ask everyone to depart soon after, remain patient during the exiting process and to not use horns within the neighborhood.
